Dr Andrew Chang is the principal Vitreoretinal specialist at **Sydney Retina Clinic and Day Surgery**. He graduated from University of Sydney Medical School with honours in 1987. His general ophthalmology training was at the Sydney Eye Hospital. He has undertaken retinal fellowships at the Royal Victorian Eye and Ear Hospital and the Manhattan Eye, Ear and Throat Hospital. In 1996, he was appointed as Assistant Professor to the University of California, Davis. Upon return to Sydney in 1997, he was appointed to the Sydney Eye Hospital as consultant Vitreoretinal Surgeon. He is currently Clinical Senior Lecturer in the Department of Ophthalmology, University of Sydney.

Dr Chang is involved in basic science and clinical research and has been awarded research grants in the United States and Australia. In 2004, he was awarded Doctor of Philosophy by the University of Sydney for his research into ocular angiography. He has authored numerous scientific papers in international and Australian scientific journals and book chapters in leading textbooks in Vitreoretinal Diseases. He is on the editorial board of Clinical and Experimental Ophthalmology.

He is heavily involved in teaching of Ophthalmology trainees and fellows at the Sydney Eye Hospital. He has been an invited speaker in Australian and International Scientific meetings.

Dr Chang practices exclusively in medical and surgical retinal disease. Medical retinal conditions include age-related macula degeneration, diabetic retinopathy, and retinal vein occlusion. Vitreoretinal surgery may be required for retinal tear and detachment, macula membrane and holes.
